Closets without Walls, 1550–1800

This archive of 205 printed closets and cabinets has been assembled with reference to Early English Books Online, Eighteenth-Century Collections Online, and the British Library catalog. Where closet or cabinet is in bold, the word refers to the space of the text itself.
